QUESTION BANK TEACHING OF ENGLISH

LONG ANSWER QUESTIONS

- 1. Make a case for and against teaching poetry in Indian schools.
- 2. How does a lesson on poetry differ from a lesson on prose? Illustrate your answer by giving examples.
- 3. How will you conduct a poetry lesson in your class so that the aims of teaching poetry in English are fully realized?
- 4. 'Poetry cannot be taught; the teacher can only create conditions in which a poem may have its fullest possible significance for the pupils reading it'. Discuss.
- 5. Suggest an approach to the presentation of poetry in the class-room which will help our pupils to appreciate and enjoy poetry.
- 6. What are the arguments in favour of and against the teaching of poetry in schools? What are your own views?
